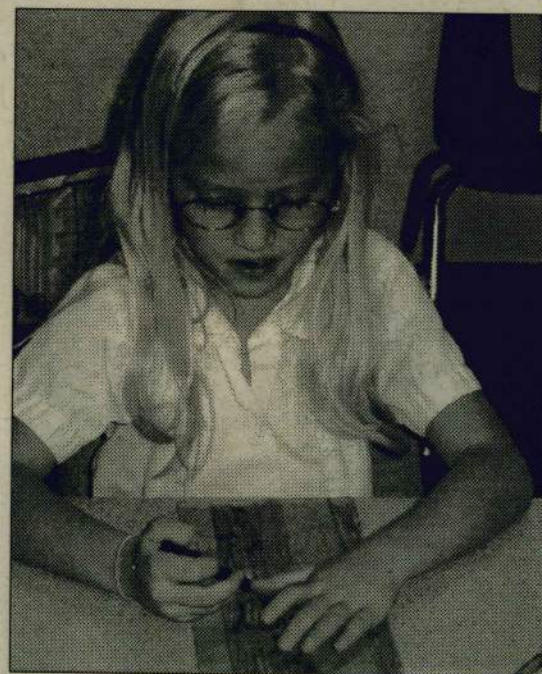

Kids Care Club celebrates 'Make Your Mark Week'
