## What we are learning the week of: May 15 - May 19


#### **ELA**

Students will finish learning their cursive letters using our Handwriting Without Tears handwriting books. These will be sent home so students can continue to practice over the summer.

We will read the poem Knoxville, Tennessee and review all our Core Knowledge poems from this past year. The prefixes uni-, bi-, tri-, and multi- will be introduced and we will review past prefixes and suffixes covered this year.



#### Math



This week we touch on our last major unit of the year. After reviewing what we have learned this year about the operation of multiplication, students will use different properties to multiply numbers. They will also learn to multiply by multiples of ten. For example:

- > 8 x 50
- > 900 x 7
- 60 x 11

#### Social Studies

We will finish learning about World Rivers by locating important river in the Eastern and Western Hemispheres. Student will also use an atlas to look at a variety of different maps.

#### Science

This week we will continue to learn about national parks and the diverse habitats within them.
