Core Knowledge Saying When in Rome, do as the Romans do.

This phrase may be used to describe other cultures and ways of living that are different from your own. For example, if you were given a fork in a Chinese restaurant, you might request chopsticks, saying, "When in Rome, do as the Romans do." This means that you want to follow the customs of how Chinese eat food while dining at their restaurant. Sometime people shorten this saying to just say, "When in Rome . . ." The saying has become so well known that many people will know what you mean just by these few words.

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
