Science Animal fish Groups


Animal Classification is our first unit of study in science! In this exciting unit, students will learn how to classify, or sort, animals by their characteristics.



We will be covering these tenses in our Daily 5 centers, spelling practice, and morning work.

Spelling

This week we will be reviewing how to add -ed and -ing to words. Students should learn to spell the root word and the word with both suffixes added.

DIVISION TIPS

This week students will practice equal groups/sharing and repeated subtraction.

- Give hands-on practice, such as dividing a basket of rolls evenly when out to dinner or opening a bag of M&Ms, counting to find the total and then dividing them evenly among siblings
- Connect repeated subtraction with repeated addition taught with multiplication
- Complete unfinished math page problems and return to school
- Use vocabulary: dividend, divisor, quotient
